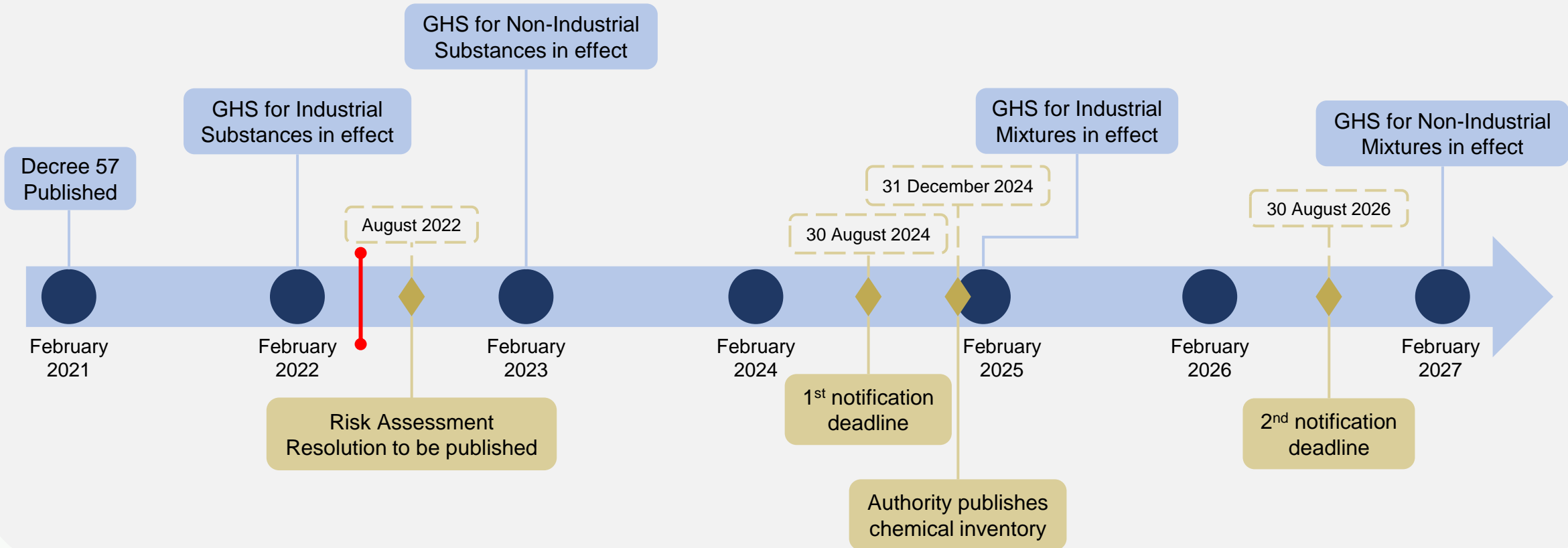
Decree 57: Regulation on the classification, labeling and notification of chemical substances and mixtures (2021)

- Authority: Ministry of Health
- National Chemical Regulation
- Make GHS mandatory (7th version)
- Manufacturers/importers >1ton/year
- Updates made every 2 years



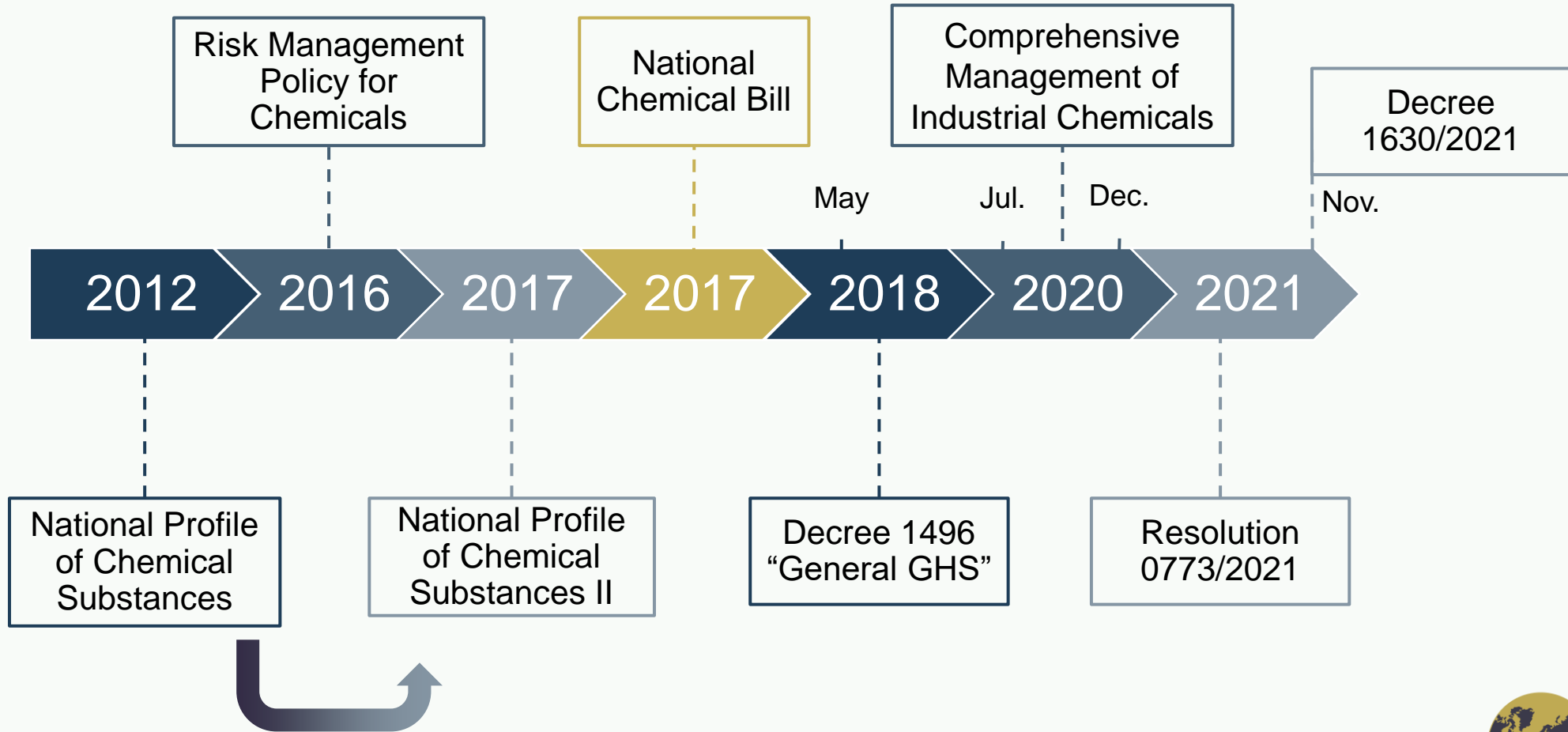

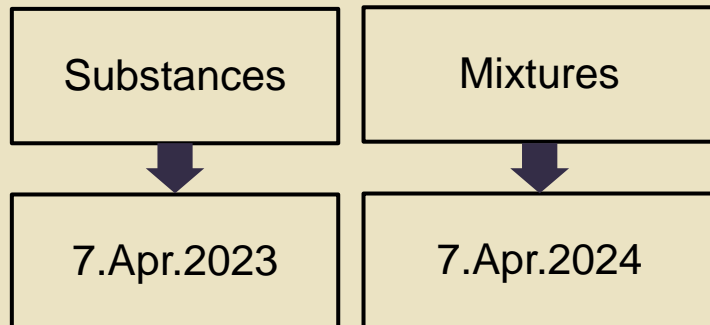

Resolution 0773/2021: GHS in the Labor Sector

- Authorities: Ministry of Labor
- Adopts GHS 6th version
- Follows European CLP

GHS Transitional periods



Decree 1630/2021: Chemical Regulatory Framework in Colombia

- Authorities: Cooperation between Ministries
 - (Commerce, Labor, Health, and Environment)
- New Managing Instruments
 - Chemical Inventory
 - Prioritization of Chemicals
 - Risk Evaluation & Risk Reduction
- New Monitoring Programs
 - Registry for Emission and Transfer of Contaminants (RETC)
 - Toxicological Management System (SGT)



Colombia

+ 6 Months

The ministries cooperation will announce the:

- *Computer Software*
- *Guiding Manual*

+ 6 Months

After the initial notification period, new substances must be notified within a 6-month deadline

+ 3 Years

Manufacturers and importers will have a 3-year window to submit their 1st substance notification after the Computer Software release

Yearly Updates

Manufacturers and importers shall submit early updates into the Computer Software

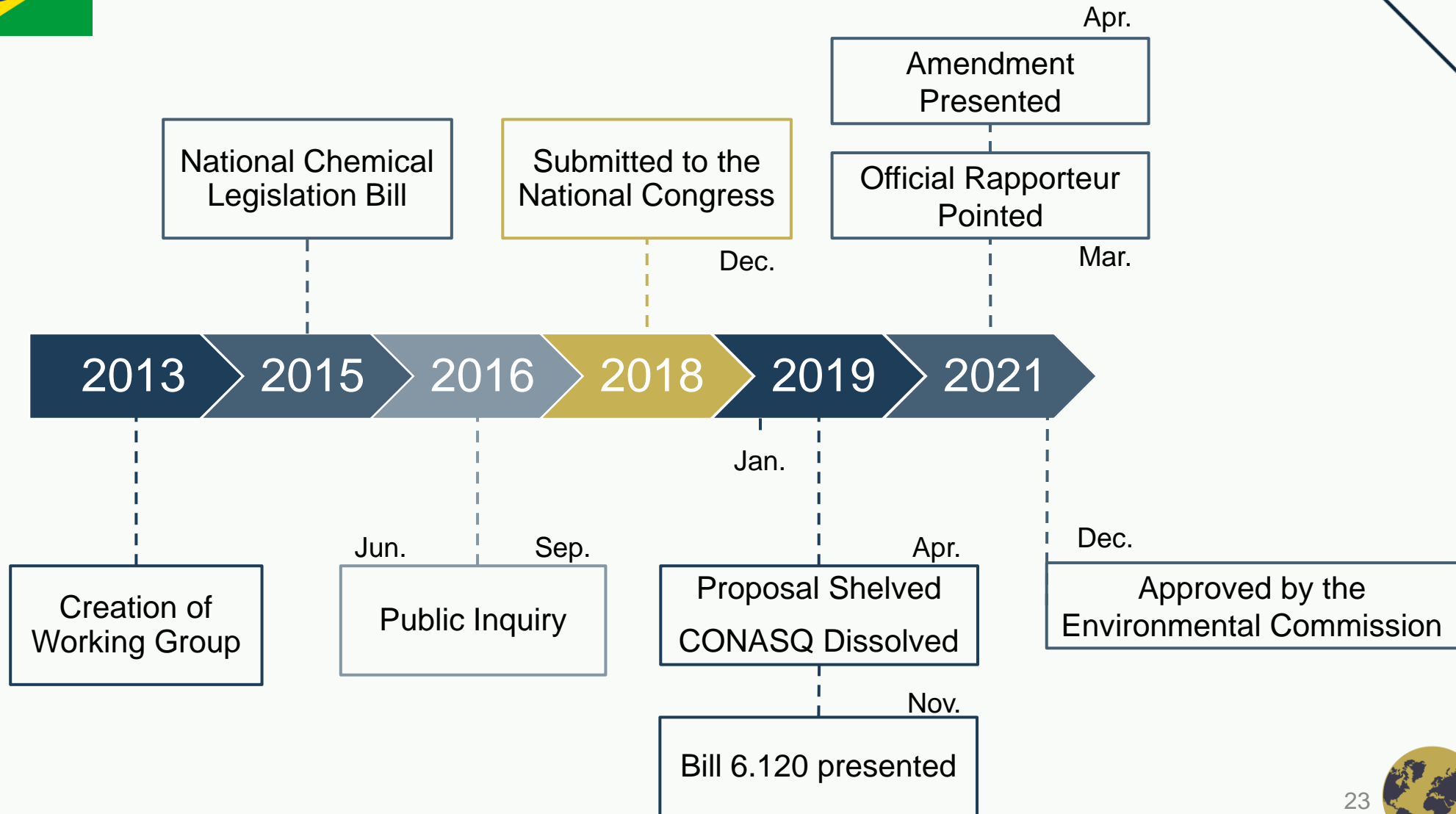

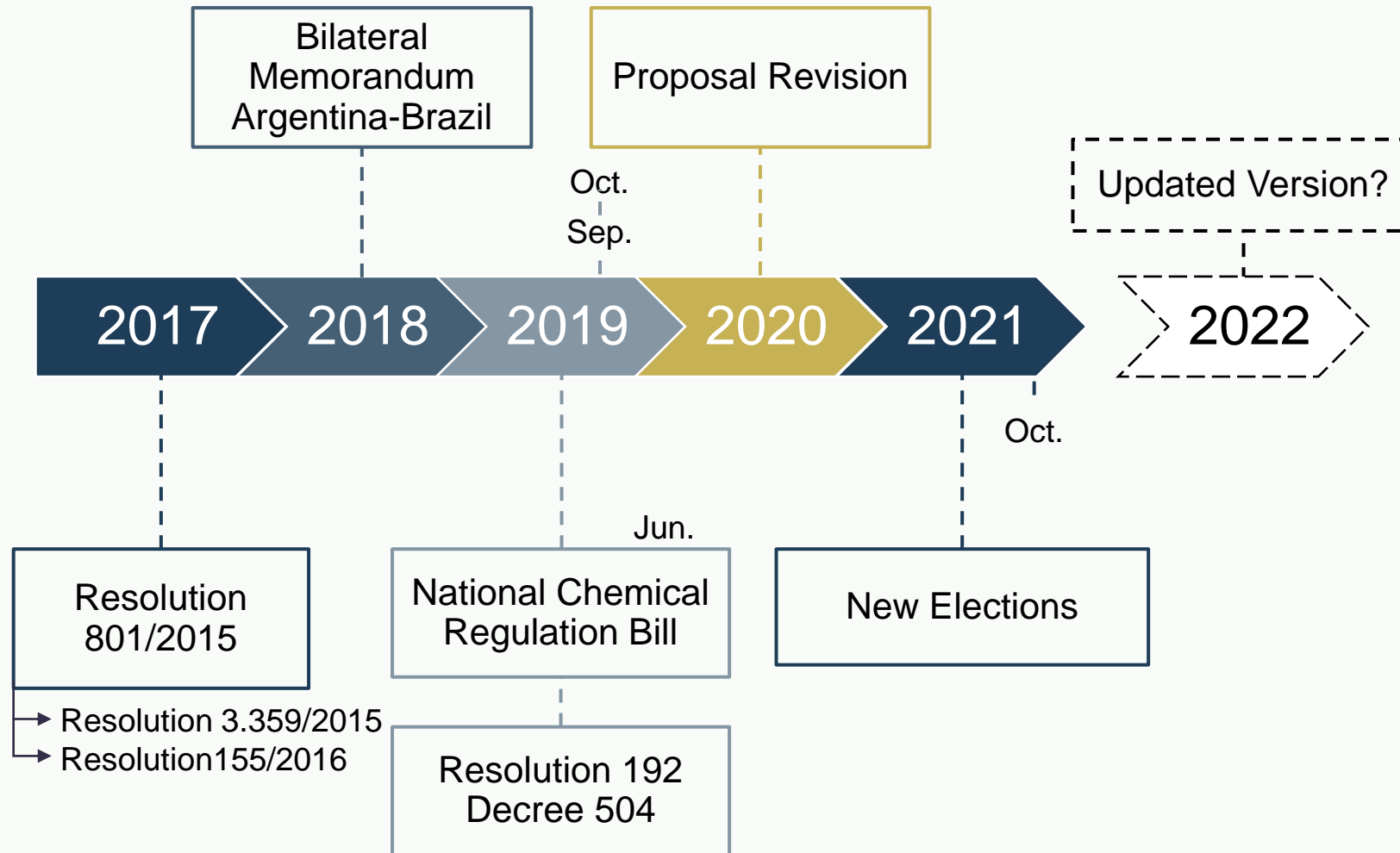

Bill 6.120/2019: Provides for the inventory, evaluation and control of chemical substances

- Amendment captures important elements (e.g., Register of Substances)
- Scope Manufacturers and Importers >1ton/year
- Has to be approved by 4 commissions in the Deputies' Chamber
 - Approved by the Environmental Commission on December 17, 2021
 - Now, the regulation is under the Social Security and Family Commission's analysis

Chemical Regulation (last draft, 2019)

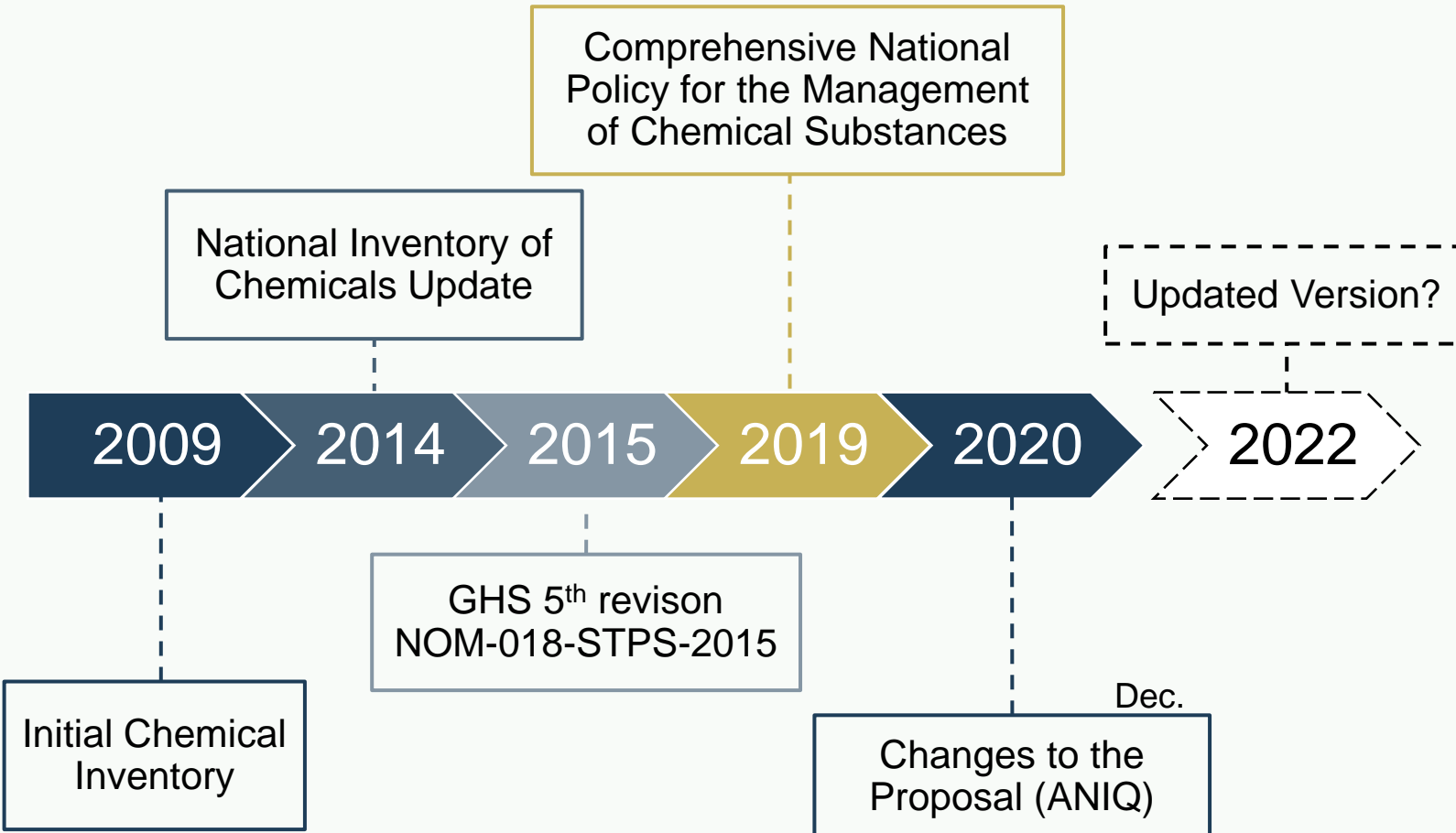
- Authority: Ministry of Labor
- Special Committee for Chemical Evaluation
- Priority List for Chemical Management
- Annual Update from Manufacturers and Importers
- 3 years transitional time

What is expected?

- Argentina is held elections in October 2021
- Updated version may be published soon

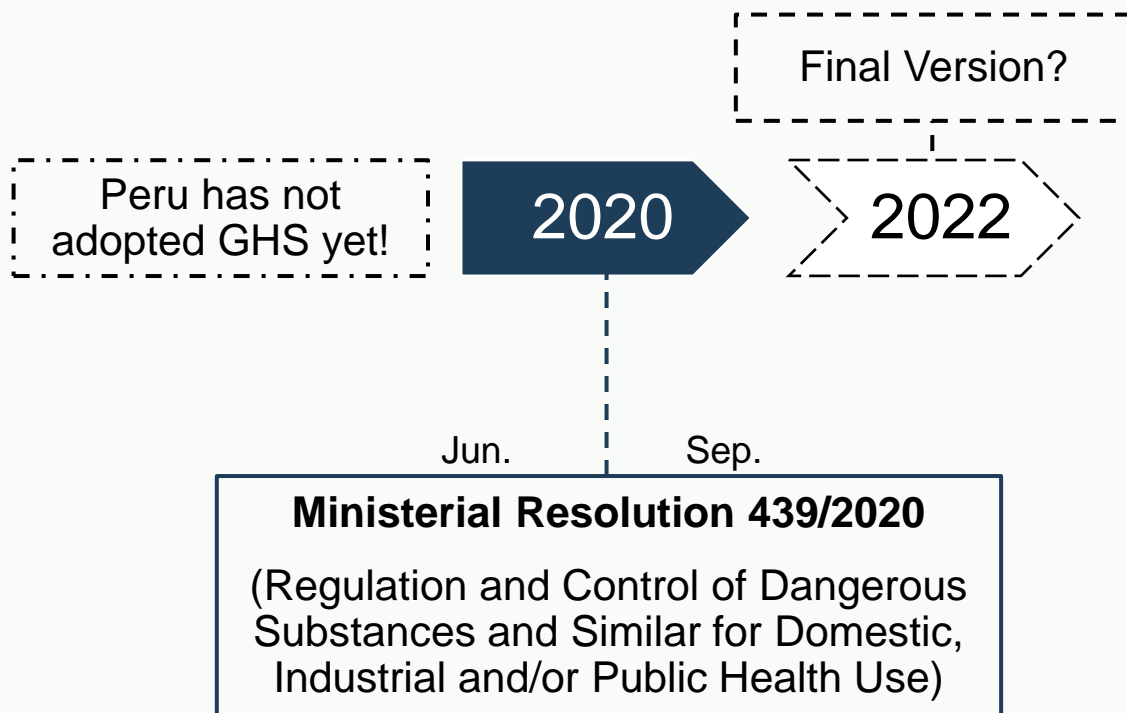
Main Differences between Proposals:

- The initial proposal is formulated by General Health Council (CSG)
- ANIQ is the Chemical Industry Association

Regulation and Control of Dangerous Substances and Similar for Domestic, Industrial and/or Public Health Use (Ministerial Resolution 439/2020):

- Authority: Ministry of Health
- Creates a National Register of Chemicals
- Address the Classification and Labeling
- Substances under a Risk Assessment
- Substances of VHC under Risk Management
- Proposes an Authorization Renewal every 3 years

General elections can considerably influence the legislative proposal fate



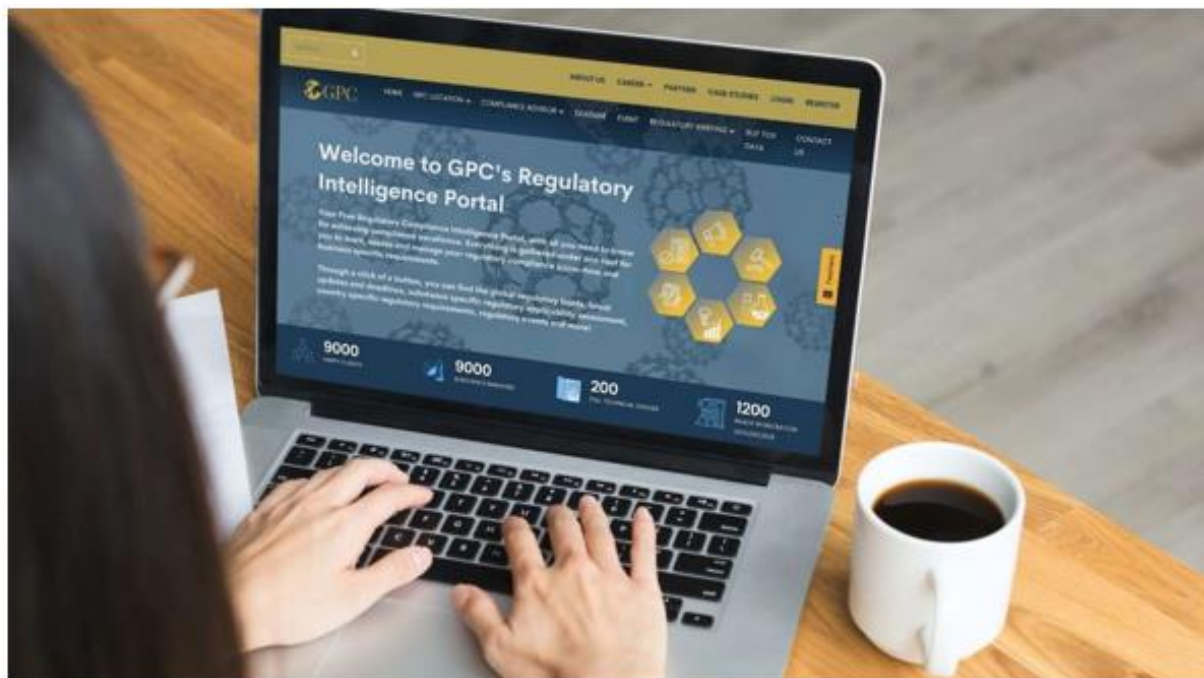
Regional Drivers:
